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The Pennsylvania Historical Association, in cooperation with local and regional historical societies and agencies, seeks to advance the study of Pennsylvania's heritage. It is the only statewide historical society now active in the Commonwealth. By its annual meetings held successively in different parts of the state, its publication of the quarterly journal, *Pennsyl*vania History, and a series of pamphlets, *Pennsylvania History Studies*, and its cosponsorship of an annual research conference in Pennsylvania history and the Institute on Pennsylvania Life and Culture, the association endeavors to stimulate scholarly activity and arouse popular interest in the state's history.

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1. The length should be a maximum of 350 words.

3. Normal citation format should be followed.

4. Items should be humorous or should reflect some unknown facet of the character or temperament of some well-known historical figure.

5. Items should be related to Pennsylvania history. Items should be submitted to:

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
