Manuscripts and Reviews

Pennsylvania History publishes documents previously unpublished and of interest to students of the Middle Atlantic region. The journal also reviews books dealing primarily with Pennsylvania history or which shed significant light on aspects of the state's past.

Manuscripts must be submitted in two copies and should conform with the University of Chicago *Manual of Style*. Footnotes should be double-spaced and placed at the end of the manuscript.
