NEW HISTORY OF PENNSYLVANIA SEEKS EDITOR

Penn State Press and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission are seeking an editor or co-editors for a new one-volume history of Pennsylvania that will synthesize recent scholarship for a broad, nonspecialized audience. We seek a person or persons well grounded in the history of Pennsylvania, who will bring fresh approaches and imagination to the study of state history. Individuals with editorial experience, ability to write for a nonacademic audience, and a track record of performing within specified financial and temporal constraints are perferred. Responsibilities include working with representatives of PSP and PHMC to determine the contents and overall shape (e.g. choice of illustrations, sidebars, etc.) of the volume and to identify contributing authors; commissioning the essays and working with authors through the entire writing and publication process; organizing and conducting at least two meetings of the authors to define a set of common questions and approaches; and writing the introduction to the volume. Work will begin in Fall 1997 or Spring 1998; projected publication date is 2000. The stipend is negotiable; PSP and PHMC understand this is a project that can be undertaken in conjunction with ongoing professional responsibilities.
