


The editor invites the submission of articles dealing with the history of Pennsylvania and the Middle Atlantic region, regardless of their specialty. Prospective authors are urged to look through past issues of the journal, where they will see that the breadth of *Pennsylvania History* articles include social, intellectual, economic, environmental, political and cultural history, from the distant and recent past. Articles may reflect investigation of new areas of research or may reflect on past scholarship. Material that is primarily of an antiquarian or genealogical nature will not be considered.

Pennsylvania History publishes documents previously unpublished and of interest to students of the Middle Atlantic region. The journal also reviews books dealing primarily with Pennsylvania history or which shed significant light on aspects of the state's past.

Manuscripts must be submitted in three copies and should conform to the *Chicago Manual of Style*. Notes should be double-spaced and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts should be submitted on disks when the article has been accepted for publication.
