The PHA welcomes proposals on a wide range of themes and from numerous disciplines, including but not limited to history, material culture, educational strategies and theories, and museum studies. There is no overarching topic that will define this next conference, but given the focus of public and academic attention on

the tercentenary of Benjamin Franklin's birth throughout the year, sessions relating to this topic are particularly welcome. Those whose proposals are accepted for the program must be members of the PHA. Please submit 5 copies of all proposals to the program committee chair, Cathy Matson, at the Department of History, University of Delaware, 121 Munroe Hall, Newark, DE 19716. Proposals should include title, description of paper or panel, a brief CV, and full contact information. Questions may be directed to cmatson@udel.edu.
