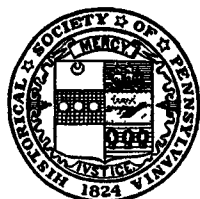

HENRY H. BISBEE, a practicing optometrist in Burlington, New Jersey, has actively pursued his interest in local history for many years. He is a member of the Grand Council of West Jersey Proprietors, and is the author of *The Burlington Story* (1952) and *Place Names in Burlington County* (1955).

H. TREVOR COLBOURN, presently Assistant Professor of American History at the Pennsylvania State University, will shortly be joining the Department of History at Indiana University. He has recently completed a study of the historical perspective of the founding fathers, and was the recipient of the Library Company of Philadelphia's Fellowship for 1957-1958.
