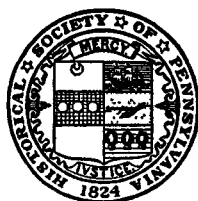

VINCENT BURANELLI, a radio news writer by profession, holds a doctorate from Cambridge University, and is a student of American thought, particularly that of the colonial period. He is the author of *The Trial of John Peter Zenger* (1957), and has contributed articles to a number of periodicals. He is now completing a book to be entitled *William Penn and James II.*

DONALD F. DURNBAUGH is Instructor in History at Juniata College. He has spent five years in relief work with the Brethren Service Commission in Europe, and is the author of *European Origins of the Brethren* (1958). In July, 1958, he published an article on Christopher Sauer in this MAGAZINE.

JAMES H. SOLTOW is Assistant Professor of History at Michigan State University. His field of research is American business history. During 1958-1959, he was a Business History Fellow at the Harvard Graduate School of Business Administration. He has also been a Research Associate at Colonial Williamsburg, and has published in a number of journals.

FREDERICK M. BINDER is the newly elected President of Hartwick College, Oneonta, New York. Since 1955 he has been Professor of History and Academic Dean at Thiel College, and during the past year was chairman of the Pennsylvania Association of Academic Deans. His research interests are in military and technological history. In January, 1958, his article "Anthracite Enters the American Home" appeared in this MAGAZINE.

WHITFIELD J. BELL, JR., is Associate Editor of *The Papers of Benjamin Franklin*, the first volume of which is to appear this fall. RALPH L. KETCHAM is an Associate Editor of *The Papers of James Madison*. In February, 1960, he will become Associate Professor of American Studies at Syracuse University.

JOHN FRANCIS McDERMOTT, Associate Professor of English at Washington University, St. Louis, Missouri, has concentrated his interest in the field of American cultural history, with an emphasis on art history. He has published many articles in a wide variety of magazines. His book *The Lost Panoramas of the Mississippi* appeared in 1958. This fall the University of Oklahoma Press will publish his *George Caleb Bingham, River Portraitist.*
