- EDWARD C. CARTER, II, Lecturer in American and Modern European History at St. Stephen's School, Rome, is writing a book on "The Radical Irish and the Rise of the Jeffersonian Republicans, 1790–1801." His article reflects a part of his research on his doctoral dissertation (Bryn Mawr College, 1962), which was entitled "The Political Activities of Mathew Carey, Nationalist, 1760–1814."
- KENNETH L. CARROLL, a native of Easton, Maryland, and a member of the Society of Friends, is Professor of Religion at Southern Methodist University. His articles on Quaker History and on the Bible have appeared in many journals. In addition, he is the author of Joseph Nichols and the Nicholites (1962), and editor of The Creative Centre of Quakerism (1965).
