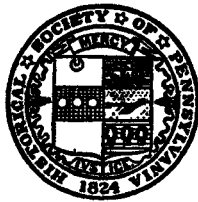

## Contributors

JOSEPH E. ILLICK is a graduate of Princeton University and earned his Ph.D. at the University of Pennsylvania. An Associate Professor of History at San Francisco State College, he is a former contributor to this *Magazine* and is the author, among other works, of *William Penn the Politician*.

CHARLES H. BOWMAN, JR., is a history instructor for East Carolina University's Division of Continuing Education. Articles by him have appeared in *The Hispanic American Historical Review* and other journals.

HAROLD W. AURAND is a history instructor at the Hazleton Campus of The Pennsylvania State University. His major interest is in the history of American labor, about which he has published several articles.

DONALD W. DISBROW's dissertation at the University of Rochester was on "The Progressive Movement in Philadelphia, 1910-1916." The author of *Schools for an Urban Society*, he is Professor of History at Eastern Michigan University.

HAROLD E. COX, Associate Professor of History at Wilkes College, is interested in the history of American urban transportation and its influences, particularly in the period 1870-1920. He is currently working on a book on public transportation, using Philadelphia as the example.

E. P. RICHARDSON, a member of The Historical Society of Pennsylvania's Board, President of the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, and former Director of the Winterthur Museum, is a distinguished authority on the history of art.

CLAUDE R. FLORY, a University of Pennsylvania Ph.D., has been Professor of English since 1945 at Florida State University. Articles by him are to be found in numerous journals, including several historical quarterlies.
