- JOSEPH E. ILLICK is a graduate of Princeton University and earned his Ph.D. at the University of Pennsylvania. An Associate Professor of History at San Francisco State College, he is a former contributor to this *Magazine* and is the author, among other works, of *William Penn the Politician*.
- CHARLES H. BOWMAN, JR., is a history instructor for East Carolina University's Division of Continuing Education. Articles by him have appeared in *The Hispanic American Historical Review* and other journals.
- HAROLD W. AURAND is a history instructor at the Hazleton Campus of The Pennsylvania State University. His major interest is in the history of American labor, about which he has published several articles.
