JAMES H. HUTSON, Editor of Publications of the Institute of Early American History and Culture, is currently working on a book on Pennsylvania politics in the pre-Revolutionary era.

PETER J. PARKER is completing his Doctoral dissertation on "The Business of Culture: Publishing and Bookselling in Philadelphia, 1763-1812." In June he joined the staff of The Historical Society of Pennsylvania as head of its Manuscript Department.
