- NANCY SLOCUM HORNICK, a University of Maryland Ph.D. in American Social and Intellectual History, is preparing a biography of Anthony Benezet. She is currently historian-writer with the United States National Park Service, Harpers Ferry Center, and is researching the history of Carpenters' Hall and its master-builders for a Park Service booklet.
- DAVID L. SALAY is a University of Delaware doctoral candidate, the title of his dissertation being "The Production of War Material for the American Army During the Revolution: The Middle Colonies." He is employed by the New York State Historical Association in Cooperstown as Curator of Library Resources.
- EDWARD T. James' dissertation at Harvard was in labor history, but his career in historical editing has taken him into biography and women's history as well. He has been co-editor and editor of three Supplements to the Dictionary of American Biography and of the three-volume Notable American Women, 1607-1950. Presently he is working on a biography of Frederick W. Taylor.
- LYNDA BELTZ is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Speech at Indiana University where she earned her Ph.D. She is writing a series of articles on the lecture careers of a number of famous Americans and hopes to do a biography of Ida M. Tarbell.
- WILLIAM H. WILSON was awarded his doctorate in history by the University of Missouri and is now a Professor of History at North Texas State University. He is the author of The City Beautiful Movement in Kansas City and Coming of Age: Urban America, 1915–1945.
