

# Contributors

ROBERT N.C. NIX, JR., is Chief Justice of Pennsylvania. A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania Law School, he served as Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania from 1972 to 1983. He became Chief Justice in 1984. Chief Justice Nix is the recipient of numerous awards and honorary degrees in recognition of his jurisprudence, humanitarian concern, and public service.

MARY M. SCHWEITZER is Assistant Professor of History at Villanova University. She is the author of *Custom and Contract: Household, Government, and the Economy in Colonial Pennsylvania* (1987).

ROBERT F. WILLIAMS is Associate Professor of Law at Rutgers University School of Law, Camden. His published works include numerous articles on state constitutional law. His coursebook on that topic will be published next year. He is now completing a book tracking the influence of the early state constitutions on the federal Constitution.

PAUL FINKELMAN is a member of the history department at the State University of New York at Binghamton. He is the author of numerous books and articles, including *An Imperfect Union: Slavery, Comity, and Federalism* (1981), and the editor of *Slavery, Race and the American Legal System, 1700-1872* 16 vols. (1987).

CLAIR W. KELLER is Professor of History and Secondary Education at Iowa State University where he teaches both early American history and social studies education courses. Keller is the author of a social studies methods book and articles on both history and teaching, and the co-author of an eighth-grade American history textbook.

SAUL CORNELL, a graduate student in early American history at the University of Pennsylvania, is currently working on a Ph.D. dissertation on the political thought and culture of the Antifederalists.

CATHERINE E. HUTCHINS is Associate Editor of *Winterthur Portfolio: A Journal of American Material Culture* and an associate editor in the Publications Office, Winterthur Museum, Winterthur, Delaware.

CHRISTOPHER COLLIER is Professor of History at the University of Connecticut and Connecticut State Historian. His books include *Roger Sherman's Connecticut: Yankee Politics and the American Revolution* (1971) and (with James Lincoln Collier) *Decision in Philadelphia: The Constitutional Convention of 1787* (1986). He also has published a number of articles on the Constitution and Constitutional history.
