**THE LIBRARY COMPANY OF PHILADELPHIA
RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS in
AMERICAN HISTORY and CULTURE for 1997-1998**

The Library Company of Philadelphia each year offers a number of short-term fellowships for research in residence in its collections, which are capable of supporting scholarship in a variety of fields and disciplines relating to the history of North America, principally in the 18th and 19th centuries. Founded in 1731, the Library Company was the largest public library in America until the 1850s and thus contains printed materials on every aspect of American culture and society in that period. It has since become a research library with over half a million books, pamphlets, newspapers, periodicals, prints, maps, photographs and manuscripts.

The collection is especially strong in Afro-Americana, German-Americana, American Judaica, history of women, domestic economy, banking and business, medicine, agriculture, natural history, philanthropy, education, art (including Philadelphia-area prints and photographs), architecture, technology, local and regional history, and the history of printing and publishing. The library also has a significant collection of British and Continental books and pamphlets of the 17th to the 19th centuries, reflecting the intense interest of Americans in the world around them. The library's holdings of American novels, plays, poems, essays, and orations up to 1860 are extensive, and complementary collections of British and Continental literature, popular non-fiction, and periodicals illuminate the context in which these literary texts were read.

The fellowship program supports both post-doctoral and dissertation research. The project proposal should demonstrate that the Library Company has primary sources central to the research topic. Candidates are encouraged to inquire about the appropriateness of a proposed topic.

The fellowships are tenable for any one month from June 1997 to May 1998. The stipend is \$1,400. International applications are encouraged since one fellowship (jointly sponsored with the Historical Society of Pennsylvania) is reserved for scholars whose residence is outside the United States.

Candidates must apply by February 1, 1997. Appointments will be made by March 15. There are no application forms. James Buchanan and the Political Crisis of the 1850s

Edited by Michael J. Birkner

In this new collection of articles leading scholars of the American Middle Period offer a fresh analysis of the troubled presidency of James Buchanan.

When Buchanan entered the White House in March 1857, he seemed well positioned to accomplish his main objectives. A canny and seasoned politician from Pennsylvania, with a reputation for moderation on slavery-related issues, Buchanan had a straightforward agenda: the amelioration of sectional tensions, the promotion of American prosperity, and the extension of the Democrats' control of the federal government.

Four years later, Buchanan left Washington convinced that he had done his best and accomplished much. In fact, he left behind a shattered party, a new Republican president, and a ruptured Union. Except for a cadre of faithful Pennsylvania friends, Buchanan's reputation lay in ruins. He has consistently been ranked among the least effective presidents in American history.

These articles grew out of a symposium at Franklin and Marshall College marking James Buchanan's two-hundredth birthday. They offer an important reevaluation of his presidency, one that will be of particular significance to those with an interest in Pennsylvania history. (Susquehanna University Press, \$29.50)

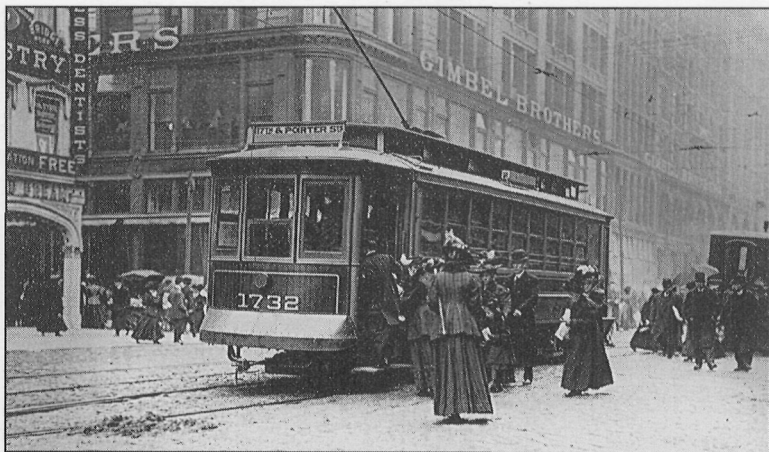
