Her research fields include factors affecting science interests and participation rates among women and minorities at both the precollege and undergraduate levels. In 1987, Dr. Matyas summarized the research on precollege science and mathematics education for females for a publication by the U.S. National Academy of Sciences. In July 1987, she convened the first U.S. national conference on women in science and engineering, entitled "Changing Vision to Reality".
