The results of this two year effort culminated in the publication of The Glass Ceiling and Women in Engineering in August, 1992.

Bertuglia, a graduate of Wichita State University, is systems planning engineer with Black & Veatch, Engineers & Architects. She is a licensed mechanical engineer. Her professional experience includes consulting engineering and management consulting, as well as finance and marketing for an investor owned electric utility.

Bertuglia is an active member of the professional engineering community. She has chaired numerous committees for the National Society of Professional Engineers, and currently serves as a Governor of Professional Engineers in Industry. Bertuglia is also active in the Society of Women Engineers; she is a founding member of the Kansas City Section.
