Congressman Amo Houghton has served since 1987 as the Representative of New York's 31st Congressional District. He is on the House Ways and Means Committee and serves on two of its subcommittees, Trade and Health. Congressman Houghton is also a member of the International Relations Committee and Vice Chairman of its Subcommittee on Africa. These posts reflect his long-standing interest and legislative leadership in those fields. He is the founder of the John Quincy Adams Society, an issues forum which brings together moderate officeholders with top business leaders.

The only former CEO of a Fortune 500 firm to serve in the House, Houghton joined Corning Glass Works (now Corning Incorporated) in 1951. A graduate of Harvard University and Harvard Business School, he began as an accountant at Corning and retired in 1986 after serving as President, Board Chairman, and Chief Executive Officer.
