Judy Jackson, Executive Assistant to the President, Babson College

Judy “JJ” Jackson is currently the Executive Assistant to the President, Babson College. Her research focuses on ethnic and gender diversity in higher education with an emphasis on faculty and leadership. Her 2000 Ed.D. dissertation at Harvard, “Race and Gender in Engineering Faculty Productivity: What Difference Do They Make?” is a landmark empirical study. The study covers the research, teaching, and service activities of 665 tenured engineering faculty in 19 research-1 institutions. Previous academic positions include: Special Advisor to the Provost on Faculty Diversity (1998-2000); Ombudsman, President’s Office (1996-9188); and Associate Dean, Undergraduate Education and Student Affairs (1989-1994), all at MIT; and Assistant Dean for Advising, Counseling, and Minority Programs (1988-1989); Assistant Dean for Minority Programs (1986-1988); and Assistant Director for Advising and Counseling (1985-1986), all at Cornell. She also served as an advisor to minority and foreign students at Bucknell University from 1981 to 1985 while she completed her Master of Arts degree.
