**T**HE Historical Society of Western Pennsylvania is a nonprofit cultural institution founded in 1879. It provides services to the public to insure the collection, preservation, and interpretation of Pittsburgh's regional history. The Historical Society operates Library & Archives, Museum, Public Programs, and Advancement divisions, and manages the Meadowcroft Museum of Rural Life, a living history museum in Washington County, under a joint operating agreement. In 1996, the Society will open a new 160,000 square-foot facility—The Senator John Heinz Pittsburgh Regional History Center—near downtown Pittsburgh.

**Membership:** Membership is open to anyone interested in the Society's goals and activities. Classes of annual membership and dues are as follows: Student, \$20; Individual, \$30; Family, \$40; Organization, \$50; Patron, \$100; Friend, \$250; Benefactor, \$500; Founders' Circle, \$1,879.
