Roman Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh

Catholicism has significantly influenced Western Pennsylvania since the first mass was performed in April 1754 by Father Denys Baron. After the French fled in 1758, more than 40 years would pass until there were enough Catholic families to form a church in Pittsburgh; the first was St. Patrick's in the presentday Strip District. The Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh covers a large area in southwestern Pennsylvania and includes the counties of Allegheny, Butler, Beaver, Lawrence, Greene, and Washington.


Knochel follows the coinciding rapid growth of the region and the Catholic community with photographs from the early 19th century to modern times. The book extensively covers Pittsburgh, the Steel Valley, and surrounding counties. It also looks at the social and community life of people of It is impossible to cover the hundreds of churches in the diocese or include histories of their beginnings, closures and mergers. The author has managed to give readers a

faith and the diversity of ethnic churches.

sense of the many facets of the diocese; unfortunately the topic's scope is very large and the book is not.



Although many churches have merged or closed, the diocese still is full of vitality. The Church of the Resurrection in the Brookline area of Pittsburgh recently celebrated its 100th anniversary, and is one of many that celebrated the important event with a publication recounting its history. Ethnic churches are also still strong as witnessed by the centennial of St. Michael the Archangel Church in Butler, an ethnic Italian church that still retains its Italian traditions. Churches are still being built in the diocese, such as Saints John and Paul Parish in Sewickley, which opened its doors in May 2010. Visitors to the Library and Archives at the Senator John Heinz History Center can read more than 400 histories of Roman Catholic churches throughout the region.


