

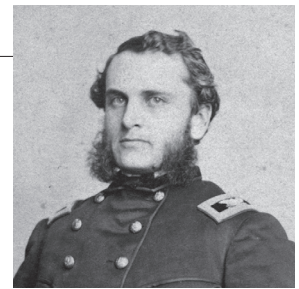
EXHIBITS

The Civil War in Pennsylvania

The History Center has developed a new traveling exhibit, sponsored by Peoples Gas Company, called *The Civil War in Pennsylvania*, especially for members of the History Center Affiliates Program (HCAP). This 500-square-foot exhibit, which will travel for four years, features five 3-D “life figures”: Martin Delany, Strong Vincent, Tillie Pierce, Dog Jack, and a figure representing the young female Allegheny Arsenal workers. Using the experiences of Pennsylvanians, the exhibit explores life on the battlefield, war efforts on the home front, and the personal support soldiers received from friends and loved ones. Two museum cases are also provided so HCAP members can display their own Civil War artifacts and tell their stories. From April through June the exhibit will travel to the following venues:

- Fayette County Historical Society
- Chartiers-Houston Community Library

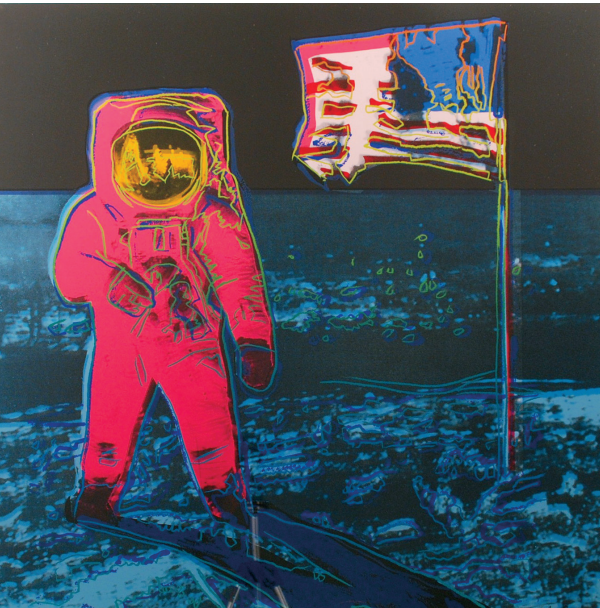
