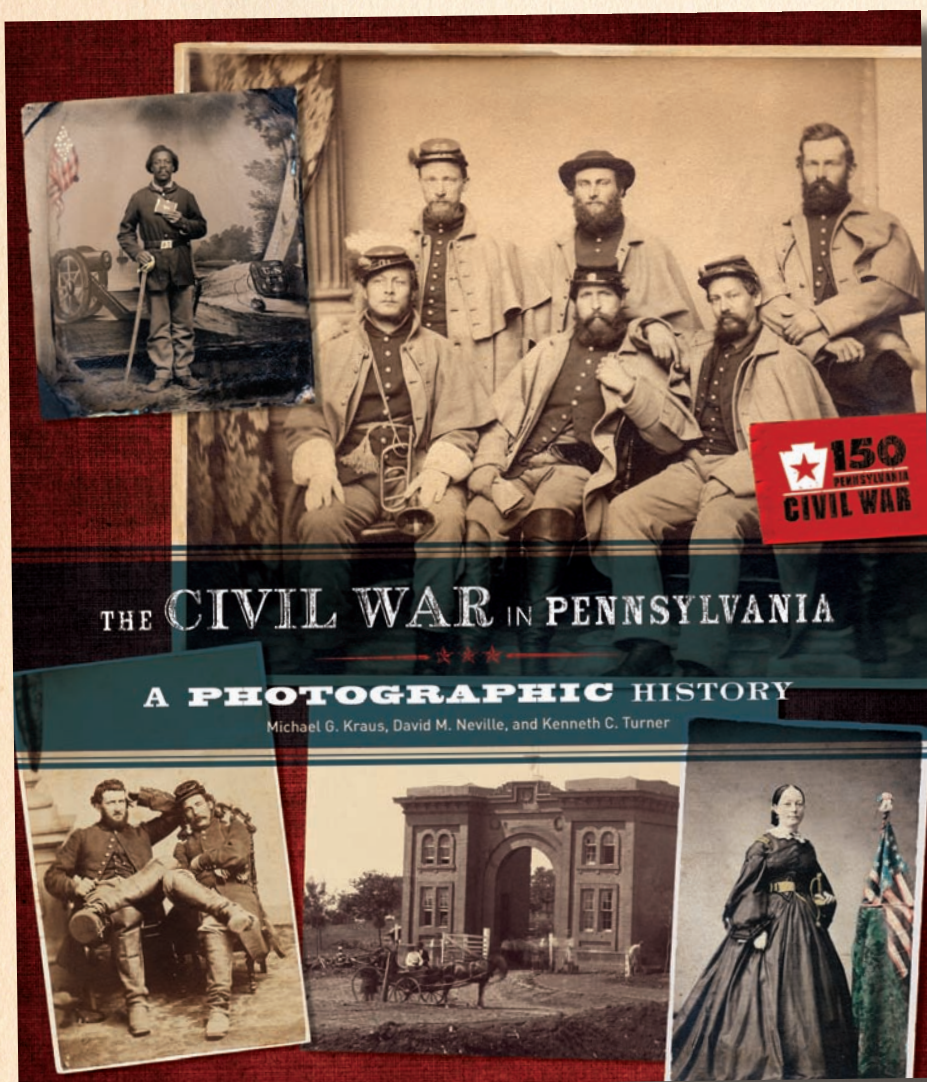


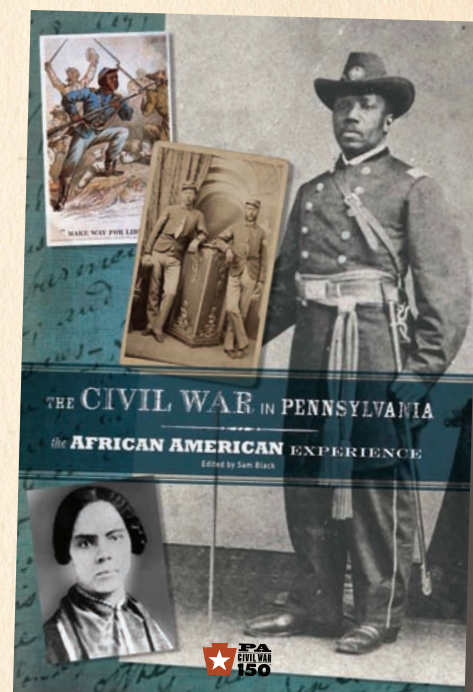

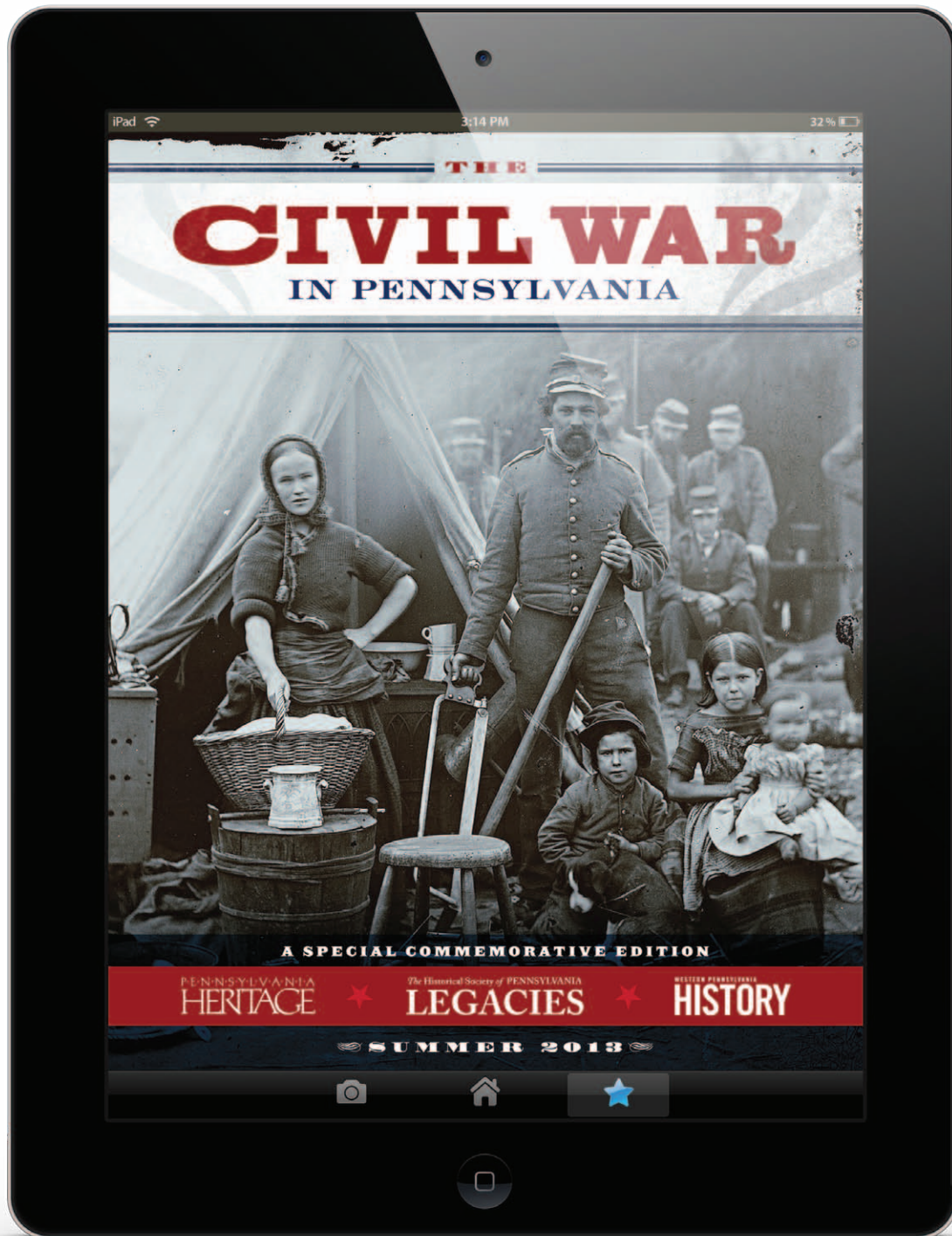

PENNSYLVANIA CIVIL WAR 150 is the state's official commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the Civil War, 2011–2015. The PACW150 Committee, convened by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission (PHMC), is a statewide alliance of history, heritage, arts, and cultural organizations. PACW150's mission is to leverage the strengths of these institutions and bring high-quality programming to the commonwealth's commemoration of the American Civil War. PACW150 includes a wide array of statewide initiatives and facilitates numerous activities and events at the regional and local levels.

The official PACW150 web site is filled with in-depth information about the war. It also includes an interactive map, an online store, helpful tips on planning a visit to Pennsylvania, and a calendar of events listing dozens of programs from lectures to reenactments.

The Civil War in Pennsylvania is a 500-square-foot exhibit that is traveling to more than 50 venues across the state. Developed by the Heinz History Center and PACW150, the exhibit features 3-D "life figures" of men and women who experienced different aspects of the war, including Strong Vincent (right), one of the heroes of Little Round Top. The State Museum of Pennsylvania features materials from *The Pennsylvania Civil War Road Show*, a multi-dimensional exhibition created by PACW150 that traveled the state in 2011–12.
