William Frank, a native of Bavaria, moved to Pittsburgh in 1846 to open a dry goods store. While many Jews stayed in merchandising, he and his brother-in-law branched out by building a glassworks in 1858. William and his wife Pauline were among the first Jews to permanently settle in Pittsburgh and helped create many of the first Jewish institutions in the city. The Franks had eight children, five of whom lived to adulthood. Pictured here about 1855 are Abraham, Isaac, Pauline, and Julia (top) and Himan, William, and Samuel (bottom).
