We Can Do It! WWII

Barensfeld Gallery through December 31, 2021

In 2015, the Heinz History Center developed *We Can Do It! WWII*, a major exhibition exploring Western Pennsylvania's role during World War II. It encouraged people to reconnect with the men and women who served the war effort in many ways, from the factory to the battlefield. After reducing its size to a 500-square-foot exhibition and sharing it with 18 History Center Affiliates Program (HCAP) sites from 2017–2020, this exhibition has now returned home to once again impart the lessons that the World War II generation teaches us.
