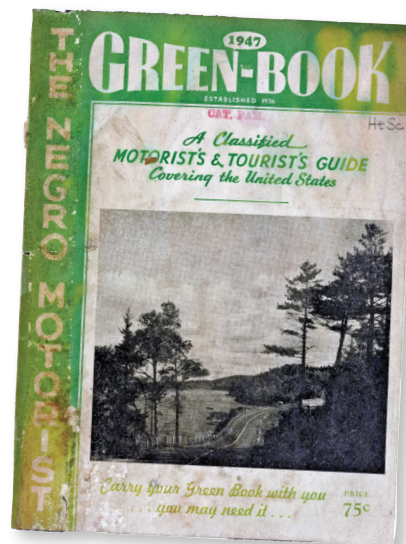
## *The Negro Motorist Green Book*
